Happy holiday season Northcrest neighbors,

As the winter weather approaches, keep in mind that any weather related damage to your roof must managed by the homeowner through their homeowner's insurance. The HOA is only responsible for age related wear and tear on the roof. Please make sure you know where your main water shut off is located. If it is located at the street, be sure you have a brass key to unlock the meter/valve cover. They can be purchased at most hardware/home improvements stores.

On the note of keeping our property looking its best please remember that bulk trash must only be placed on the curb on Tuesday, the <u>day before</u> pick up. All holiday lights and decorations must be removed by January 15. Remember, you are responsible for picking up after your pet, everywhere! In addition to damaging lawns, pet waste is a water quality issue.
